


Pursuant to section 68115 of the Government Code, it has been determined that because of severe winter weather, including blizzard conditions, which has forced the closure of the South Lake Tahoe courthouse, there is an immediate threat to the orderly operations of the Superior Court of California, County of El Dorado. As a result, and at the request of Presiding Judge Suzanne N. Kingsbury, it is ordered that the Superior Court of El Dorado County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that January 10 and 11, 2017, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a (section 68115(c));
- Declare that January 10 and 11, 2017, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825 and Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 631, 632, 637, and 657 (section 68115(d));
- Extend, to no later than January 12, 2017, the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire because the emergency condition described herein prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (section 68115(e)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to no more than 15 days (section 68115(g)).

This order applies to proceedings in which the last day of the statutory time period would occur on or between January 10, 2017, and January 11, 2017.

This order applies only to the court's South Lake Tahoe courthouse.



**GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF  
AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR  
OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the January 11, 2017, Order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the California Judicial Council, issued in response to the January 10, 2017, request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of El Dorado County ("Court"), this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. For purposes of computing time for filing papers with the Court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, January 10, 2017, and January 11, 2017, are deemed holidays (Gov. Code, § 68115(c));

2. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, and Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 631, 632, and 657, January 10, 2017, and January 11, 2017, are deemed holidays (Gov. Code, § 68115(d));


3. In appropriate cases, a judge of the Court may extend, to no later than January 12, 2017, the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire because the emergency condition described herein prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(e)); and

4. In appropriate cases, a judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(g)).

This order applies to proceedings in which the last day of the statutory time period would occur on or between January 10, 2017, and January 11, 2017.
